Dr. Goodstein: *Dr. Judith Goodstein came to Caltech as the Institute's first archivist in 1968. In the years since, she has built the archives into a notable resource in science history. Dr. Goodstein has been a faculty associate since 1982 and registrar since 1989. She earned her BA from Brooklyn College in 1960 and her PhD from the University of Washington in 1969. She has taught courses in the history of science at Caltech, UCLA, and Cal State University, Dominguez Hills. Her fields of research include the history of chemistry, 20th century Italian mathematicians, and modern American science. Dr. Goodstein has lectured widely on these topics, both in the United States and abroad, and she is the author of a large number of articles, monographs, and invited papers.*

Dr. Erwin: *Charlotte, or Shelley, Erwin is currently senior archivist at the California Institute of Technology in Pasadena. With a bachelor's degree in English literature from Vassar College and a doctorate in music history from Yale, she entered the archival profession in 1988 and became a Certified Archivist in 1996. At Caltech, she specializes in archiving collections in the history of science and technology, while engaging in a wide spectrum of archival work from readers services to preservation to collection processing and description. Most recently she has curated an online exhibit in honor of the 1906 San Francisco quake, "Documenting Earthquakes." (<http://archives.caltech.edu/exhibits/earthquake/index.html>)*
